New Orleans' Odyssey House Rises from the Remnants of Former Ford Dealership

Even a massive fire and Hurricane Katrina could not stop the eventual reconstruction of a historic two-story Landmark. Designed in 1925 by noted NOLA architect Emile Weil for the Bohn Motor Company Automobile dealership, the reconstruction project began when the building was lacking a roof and windows. Only the existing brick exterior façade was salvageable.

Practically rebuilding from the ground up on the existing base, architects selected WINCO's 3250 Steel Rep Windows to create a similar look to the original building. The new windows — featuring laminated hurricane-resistant glass, 5/8 muntin grids, and a Quaker Bronze Kynar finish — are ready to stand the test of time and New Orleans' turbulent weather. The historic building is now home to Odyssey House, an addiction treatment center.
