For safety and security, a single point of entry into a lobby leads to modular classroom buildings showcasing window systems from Winco. Our 4410 single-hung window series, as well as a few 3410 sliding window series, were selected for the project. Their tried-and-true proven design offers ideal daylighting, ventilation, and ease of maintenance any school requires.

The Villages K-8 Charter Schools include one building designated for elementary students and the other for middle school students. Both feature modular furniture and flexible design space to create areas for individual and collaborative learning. Across from the entrance lobby is a shared gymnasium and a large, open courtyard secured on the interior side of all buildings.





Classroom buildings feature plenty of window openings, from vertical light wells that allow daylight to fill common areas to the hundreds of Winco 4410 windows used in the classrooms.
